The graduation milestone inspires many families to make a capstone gift—a special pledge that celebrates their graduate’s Brown experience. Below are some examples of capstone gifts that resonate with our Brown families.

ENDOWMENT GIVING OPPORTUNITIES

Undergraduate financial aid

Help bring more talented students to Brown by establishing a scholarship or financial aid fund.

Endowed financial aid funds start at \$100,000. Named scholarships start at \$250,000.

Faculty support

Support Brown’s commitment to recruiting and retaining the professors who will elevate their departments—and their students—to even greater heights.

An endowed dean’s faculty fund begins at \$500,000. Named professorships start at \$2 million. Over time, families may add gifts to their faculty funds and convert them into named professorships.

Athletics equipment and travel funds

Provide support for new equipment, enhanced practice space, travel to competitions, and coaches’ discretionary funds. Couple your gift with an annual-use commitment to make an immediate as well as an enduring impact.

Endowed athletic funds start at \$100,000.

Named rooms and spaces

Expand and upgrade physical spaces across campus to support the innovation, collaboration, and excellence that characterize a Brown education.

Opportunities exist throughout campus to name spaces in recognition of your family’s connection to Brown.

The Brown Fund

Support Brown where it's most needed.

Impact Funds

Strengthen specific, high-priority University initiatives through targeted philanthropic opportunities.

Gifts can be made to the BrownConnect Fund, Pathways to Diversity and Inclusion Fund, Humanities Fund, and Campus Sustainability Fund.

Affinity Scholarships

Foster academic excellence by cultivating a diverse and inclusive community of scholars.

Gifts can be made to the Inman Page Black Alumni Council Brown Annual Fund Scholarship, the International Brown Annual Fund Scholarship, and the Mercedes Domenech Brown University Latino Alumni Council Brown Annual Fund Scholarship.

Brown offers all admitted undergraduate students full financial aid to meet demonstrated financial need, based solely on the amount of that need. Funding for a Brown University Scholarship, which does not have to be repaid, may come from various sources, including our affinity scholarships. Some of these funding sources have a donor preference.

Regardless of the availability of Donor Preference Scholarships, all students receive the full amount of the Brown University Scholarship award that was determined by the Office of Financial Aid, without regard to any characteristic protected under applicable law or Brown University policy. Thus, affinity-supported scholarships aid the University in providing all undergraduate students with sufficient financial aid.

Professional School Annual Funds

Advance the work of the University's professional schools.

Gifts can be made to the Brown Medical Annual Fund, the School of Engineering Annual Fund, the School of Public Health Annual Fund, and the Watson School Annual Fund.

MULTI-YEAR OPPORTUNITIES

Brown Annual Fund Scholarship

Provides need-based financial aid for a deserving undergraduate student.

Minimum gift of \$25,000/year for four years.

BrownConnect Internship Fund

Ensures financial support for and access to high-quality internship and research opportunities.

Minimum gift of \$25,000/year for four years.
